





2022 Indigenous VET Study Scholarships

About the scholarships

Newmont Boddington Gold (NBG) is offering six \$500 study costs scholarships. The study scholarships will be awarded to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders preferably from the local Wilman Traditional Owner (TO), Gnaala Karla Booja (GKB) Native Title Claimant Group and/or Noongar Aboriginal people who are enrolled in South Metropolitan TAFE (SM TAFE) courses.

What is the scholarship?

The scholarship covers \$500 towards study costs.

Students undertaking a course of study in any of the following industry areas may be eligible for the Newmont Boddington Gold scholarship:

- · Aerospace, Maritime and Logistics
- Agriculture, Animals, Science and the Environment
- Automotive
- Building and Construction
- Business and Finance
- Creative Industries
- Defence
- · Education and Community Services
- · Engineering and Mining
- English, Languages and Foundation Studies
- · Health, Beauty and Fitness
- · Hospitality, Tourism and Events
- Information Technology, Library and Digital.

Am I eligible?

To be eligible for this scholarship, you must be:

- an Australian Citizen or Permanent Resident
- of Aboriginal descent with connection with NBG's key Aboriginal stakeholder groups including: Wilman Traditional Owner; Gnaala Karla Booja Native Title Claimant Group; and/or Noongar Aboriginal people
- · enrolled in one of SM TAFE's courses.

Selection process

SM TAFE and the Peel/Rockingham Jobs and Skills Centres (JSC) can assist applicants to complete the application form for selection for the six study scholarships.

How to apply

Complete and submit the attached application form providing:

- evidence of enrolment in SM TAFE course
- evidence of the connection with the identified Aboriginal cultural groups.
